All three of these resources provide adequate (and invaluable) information about the diagnosis and management of general obstetric and gynaecological diseases. Interns may argue why they prefer one handbook over another when analyzing their fullness or questioning why each other Coats are lopsided, but the most important feature any guide is its accessibility. Now that we've entered the digital age, Amazon has intelligently created a sleek interface for students and residents to read and annotate their favorite books using its Kindle app on every mobile device. Other companies create apps for the same devices, hoping that they can be more convenient for the sleep-deprived user. And some of these apps developed for medical students and residents have been amazing! Look at Medscape and Epocrates to see the standard of efficiency and availability. Dr. Gordon and Scrub Hill Press tried to make such an application, but, unfortunately, failed miserably. The concept of turning their manual into an app is great, and the search function is really quick and easy to use. However, once you find what you are looking for in your search, all effectiveness is lost in trying to access the information. Instead of using appropriate index words to serve as quicklinks to block text regarding topics such as ovarian cancer, the user should switch between an index and pages that can only have one sentence of text in it with the rest of the space completely empty. This doesn't get more egregious than when trying to look at differences in different stages of ovarian cancer. To make matters worse, the app is more expensive than ordering a handbook to carry around. In contrast, the Kindle edition of the Handbook of Cheng is even more awesome than a paper copy. Apple processors can perform extremely quick searches through text for targeted search, and the ability to use the contents of the book as quicklinks for any section you can read works very well. For example, you can select ovarian cancer from the contents and be immediately delivered to this section with review, screening, clinical manifestations, diagnosis, pre-surgery, staging, treatment, and observation for several pages. The user can change the font, size, background color, brightness in the top corner of the Kindle app, and effectively switch from section to have reading back to the contents at the touch of a button. And the Kindle version is even cheaper than imitating the leather version. All of these positives can be attributed to the Johns Hopkins Guide as well. The Kindle version of their guide is half the price of their paper version, however the fact that the book has twice as much information as Cheng may or may not be desirable to the user. Being able to highlight text, search for it effectively, and zoom in on images makes reading tutorials and guides on Kindle amazing. It won't be long before all of our tutorials and guides have quicklinks for interactive content such as quizzes, audio features and videos. Keep an eye on the App Store though, because I'm sure there will be better and better apps to help all of us students and residents continue to learn. more effective image.
